People who have a weakened immune system are at a higher risk of having complications associated with Influenza and COVID-19. Those that fall into the high risk category are people with underlying conditions, people over the age of 65, and children. For individuals with a weakened immune system, the virus can cause severe symptoms that can lead to deadly respiratory infections such as pneumonia.

If you don't fall into the high risk category, you may be wondering why it is so important for you to receive a vaccine as well. That is where the term 'Herd Immunity' comes in. Herd immunity is when a large portion of the population is vaccinated against a certain virus therefore making it harder for the virus to bounce from person to person. Especially those people with weakened immune systems. Without vaccinations, the virus can spread fast and make a lot of people sick.

COVID-19 and Seasonal Influenza vaccinations are free with most insurance plans. For those who aren't insured, the Uninsured and Underinsured Adult Vaccine Program (UUAV) and the Minnesota Vaccines for Children Program (MnVFC) can provide support in getting a vaccine.
